C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

C.1. Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of World Archery, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

C.2. Additional IF Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games, all athletes, including those receiving Tripartite Commission Invitation Places, must have achieved the following Minimum Qualification Score (MQS) between 1st day of the World Archery Championships 2023 and 28 June 2024 by name at a WA-registered event.

Men	640	70m round
Women	610	70m round

World Archery (WA) will review the scores of all entered athletes to verify that they have achieved the above-mentioned requirement. The WA Executive Committee will make the final determination on the eligibility to participate in the Olympic Games of any athlete who has not met the MQS at a WA-registered event but can demonstrate adequate proof of reaching the MQS. This process will be completed by 30 June 2024.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

D.1. QUOTA PLACES

Athletes from NOCs outside the defined continental area may not compete in the Continental Championships. The final standings of the team match play competition in each Continental Qualification Tournament (CQT) will be used to allocate the following team quota places:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Europe: one (1) team place per gender; - Asia: one (1) team place per gender; - Americas: one (1) team place per gender.
<p style="text-align: center;">9 (3 teams)</p>	<p>Final World Team Qualification Tournament (FTQT), date and location TBC A Final Qualification Tournament is a standalone event, it could be a separate world ranking event held prior to a World Cup Stage. NOCs of the three (3) highest ranked (*) teams, per gender, at the FTQT will obtain three (3) quota places. The FTQT will be open to all NOCs that did not qualify a team through the 2023 World Archery Championships and the CQT and will be held at the end of the qualification period.</p> <p>(*) When ranked is used in the system, it is the ranking based on the final matchplay results.</p> <p>The top 3 ranked teams refers to the gold, silver and bronze medal winning teams of the FTQT.</p> <p>If any of the three (3) NOCs that qualified three (3) quota places through the FTQT had already obtained one (1) quota place for the individual competition, this individual quota place will be added to the list of available quota places at the Final World Individual Qualifying Tournament (see below).</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">5 per gender (5 teams)</p>	<p>Continental Games (CGs): Europe, Africa, Americas, Oceania, Asia NOCs of the highest placed mixed team in the Continental Mixed Team competition will earn one (1) women's and one (1) men's quota place for a total of two (2) quota places.</p>



	<p>Should the host country be winner of the European Games Mixed Team competition, the next-highest placed (i.e., silver medallist) will obtain one (1) mixed team quota.</p> <p><u>Replacement continental games qualifications</u></p> <p>If the mixed team archery is not on the programme of a CGs, the 2 places (one for each gender) of the relevant continent will be added to the list of available quota places at the Final World Individual Qualifying Tournament (see below).</p> <p>There will be no additional specific system for the mixed team event.</p> <p>The highest ranked 16 mixed teams of the ranking round in the Olympic Games will enter the Olympic Games Mixed Team competition. The top men and women score of the countries that have athletes in both genders will be used to determine the ranking of the NOC. If there is a tie for the last place (16th), a shoot off will be conducted to determine the last qualified team.</p>

3	<p>2023 World Archery Championship (WAC), 28 July – 6 August 2023, Berlin, GER</p> <p>Three (3) quota places will be allocated to the NOCs of the highest ranked athletes from NOCs which have not qualified through the team competition, with a maximum of one (1) quota place per NOC. If not, all places can be allocated in the top 8 then the places will be added to the final qualification tournament.</p>
6	<p>Continental Games (CGs) for Asia, Europe, and the Americas</p> <p>NOCs of the two (2) highest placed athletes from different NOCs in the Continental Games will each earn one (1) quota place in the relevant gender. If the NOC already obtained (a) quota place(s) in that gender a re-allocation will happen as defined below.</p> <p>Should an athlete of the Host Country be among the two (2) highest placed of the European Games Individual competition, the next highest placed athlete will obtain the corresponding quota place.</p> <p>An NOC shall not obtain more than one (1) quota place per gender at the CG</p>
10	<p>Continental Qualification Tournaments (CQTs)</p> <p>A Continental Qualification Tournament is a standalone event, it should be a separate world ranking event held prior to or after the continental championships. A Continental Qualification Tournament cannot be combined with a Continental Games.</p> <p>If an NOC obtained a quota place at the WAC or CG's, no athlete of the same gender from this NOC may compete at the CQT.</p>



	<p>Athletes from NOCs outside the defined continental area may not compete in the CQT.</p> <p>By 31 December 2022, WA will identify one (1) Continental Qualification Tournament (CQT) in each continent. The final standings of the individual match play competition in each CQT will be used to allocate the following individual quota places:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Europe: three (3) quota places per gender; - Asia: two (2) quota places per gender; - Americas: two (2) quota places per gender; - Africa: two (2) quota places per gender; and - Oceania: one (1) quota place per gender. <p>This being understood that (i) the various quota places shall be attributed to the NOC of the highest ranked athletes and (ii) an NOC shall not obtain more than one (1) quota place per gender at the CQT.</p>
2	<p>Final World Individual Qualification Tournament (FIQT), date and location TBC</p> <p>A Final Qualification Tournament is a standalone event, it could be a separate world ranking event held prior to a World Cup Stage.</p> <p>NOCs of the two (2) highest ranked athletes per gender at the FIQT will obtain one (1) quota place.</p> <p>The FIQT will be open to all NOCs that have not obtained a quota place per gender through the other prior qualification events and will be held at the end of the qualification period.</p> <p>Each NOC can obtain up to one (1) quota place per gender at the FIQT.</p> <p>The tournament will be held in conjunction with an Archery World Cup tournament to avoid any additional costs to NOCs/Member Associations.</p> <p>In case the FIQT doesn't meet the validity criteria, World Archery will refer to the section Reallocation of unused Qualification Places and the section on FIQT which will be used to allocate the places.</p>

D.2. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will try to obtain qualification places through the qualification system but will automatically qualify three (3) quota places per gender, on the condition that they enter three (3) athletes per gender at the 2023 World Archery Championships.



Should the host country enter only one (1) or two (2) athletes per gender at the 2023 World Archery Championships, they will automatically qualify (1) athlete in the respective gender for the Individual Competitions in case they did not obtain any places through the regular qualification system.

D.3. UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Four (4) Universality places, two (2) per gender are made available to eligible NOCs at the Olympic Games.

On 1 October 2023, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Universality places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2024. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of Universality places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the sport concerned.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

E.1. CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

Priority of events

Since certain NOCs can obtain quota places at the World Championships as well as Continental Games, and given a Continental Games can take place prior to the World Championships, the following order will be respected from highest to lowest in order to allocate the various quota place:

1. World Championships;
2. Continental Games;
3. Continental Qualifiers;
4. Final Qualifying Tournament;
5. World Ranking List.

World Archery will publish the results of each event within 1 day after the event on the World Archery website (www.archery.sport) and update a Qualification Place **tracker**, to illustrate the quota places that have been achieved.

World Archery will confirm in writing to the NOCs within five (5) days after the last day of each event, or ranking, the quota places they have been allocated. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm to World Archery if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in section **G. Qualification Timeline**.

E.2. CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to World Archery by 1st March 2024 the use of its host country places.



F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If the host country obtained a team place at the WAC, the fourth ranked team at the FTQT will also obtain a quota place.

Any allocated quota places that have not been confirmed by the NOC, by the required quota place confirmation deadline or the NOC has declined the quota place or the athlete obtaining the quota place commits an anti-doping violation, then the following principles will be used for reallocating the quota places:

F.1.1. Before the final individual or team qualification tournament (FIQT/FTQT):

Quota places will be awarded to the next highest ranked eligible athlete/NOC team, to a maximum of eight place for individual and fourth place for team/mixed team in the final results of the respective event in which the quota place was attained.

If the quota place cannot be awarded based on the final event results, where they were attained, the remaining quota places will be allocated at the final individual and team qualification event (FIQT/FTQT).

Note: The FTQT will always be held before the FIQT to ensure that if a team has already attained an individual quota, prior to the FTQT, and then obtains a team quota, that individual place will be first allocated based on the final ranking results list of the FIQT.

F.1.2. After the final individual or team qualification tournament (FIQT/FTQT):

All unused/returned individual, team/mixed team quota places will be reallocated using the respective individual and team/mixed team world ranking list produced by World Archery TBC.

If unused quota places cannot be reallocated according to the principles mentioned above, the remaining quota places will be allocated as additional Universality places.

F.1.3. Refugee Places

The refugee places will be removed if they have not been attained.

F.2. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

If the host country does not select a team, or does not enter three (3) athletes per gender at the 2023 World Archery Championships, the three (3) quota places will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked eligible team at the Final World Team Qualification Tournament (FTQT).

If the host country does not select a team, and decides to only participate in the individual competition, they will be entitled to enter one (1) athlete in the individual competition and, the NOC of the next highest



ranked team at the Final Team Qualification Tournament will qualify three (3) quota places and one less quota place will be awarded at the FIQT.

F.3. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED UNIVERSALITY PLACES

If the Tripartite Commission is not able to allocate a Universality place, it will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked eligible athlete, not yet qualified, on the Archery World Ranking List after the FQT (XX June 2024 TBC).
