

# SPORTS FOR CLIMATE ACTION FRAMEWORK

## Letter of Commitment

*By joining the Sports for Climate Action Framework, organizations commit to supporting its overarching mission to help drive the sports sector to net-zero emissions by mid-century, in line with a 1.5°C pathway. Organizations also commit to the Framework's various principles and values related to collaboration, education and advocacy for climate action.*

Recognizing the critical need for all stakeholders around the globe to help implement the Paris Agreement and to accelerate the transformative change needed to reach greenhouse gas emission neutrality (i.e. climate neutrality) in the second half of the twenty-first century, I am pleased to confirm that **Comité Olímpico Cabo-verdiano (CPV NOC)** supports the vision outlined in the UNFCCC Sports for Climate Action Framework.

With this communication, we express our intent to support and implement the principles enshrined in the Sports for Climate Action Framework and we commit to working collaboratively with our peers and relevant stakeholders to enhance the climate action agenda in the sports sector and to use sports as a unifying tool to drive climate awareness and action among global citizens. **Comité Olímpico Cabo-verdiano (CPV NOC)** commits to:

**Set an interim (2030) and long-term emissions reduction target:** My organization commits to setting a target of 50% emissions reduction by 2030<sup>12</sup> as a minimum and a net-zero emissions target by 2040.

**Measure<sup>3</sup> & report<sup>4</sup>:** My organization commits to consistently measuring and publicly disclosing its annual climate footprint and emissions reductions progress.

**Plan for reaching net zero emissions:** My organization commits to submitting a concrete plan (within 12 months of joining the Framework) on how it intends to reach interim targets.

**Communicate:** My organization will communicate this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.
